

Dear JRT,

Several developments over the past month give me hope about the growing recognition of the critical importance of agriculture and food systems for the future of our climate, planet and people.

Egypt's COP27 Presidency has shown laudable commitment to put agriculture centre stage at the UN climate talks, announcing an entire day focused on adaptation and agriculture. This is an enormous opportunity to ensure that our agri-food systems receive the attention they deserve.

This month we also announced, together with 14 leaders in the food space, COP's firstever <u>Food Systems Pavilion</u>. The organizers span the public, private and civil society sectors – from farmers and youth to policymakers and scientists. This diversity of expertise and insight reflects the importance of collaboration across the value chain in dealing with the scale of our challenge and delivering lasting, equitable solutions.

In the US, the Inflation Reduction Act was signed into law. This marks an important step to support farmers in pursuing practices that mitigate climate change and make American farmland more resilient to flood and drought. The Act, which includes more than \$20 billion to promote climate friendly farming, is an encouraging investment in a sustainable future.

In all, it is heartening to see agriculture rising on political agendas around the world, and I'm excited to join the <u>African Green Revolution Forum</u> in Rwanda next week alongside thought-leaders, policymakers, farmers, and innovators to continue discussing how food systems strategies, investment plans, and coordination mechanisms can accelerate action on the ground and ensure a just transition for all.

Momentum is building for a just rural transition, and I am hopeful that we will see COP27 putting it truly in motion.
