

Dear JRT,

Integrating climate, nature, and social equity goals into both short- and long-term food crises responses has never been more critical. The devastating earthquakes that struck Turkey and Syria on 6 February have underlined the vital role of humanitarian aid in the wake of natural disasters and other crises. At the same time, they remind us that we can't rely on over-burdened humanitarian agencies to address every disaster. The scope and complexity of the food crisis in particular requires much more concerted, long-term, and far-reaching actions to change the ways we produce, trade, and consume food.

The need for a just and systemic change was emphasized in a recent <u>Joint Statement on</u> <u>the Global Food and Nutrition Security Crisis</u> by the heads of the Food and Agriculture Organization, International Monetary Fund, World Bank Group, World Food Programme, and World Trade Organization. The statement makes several urgent recommendations to reverse worsening food and nutrition security, including enhancing private sector policies and repurposing harmful subsidies.

At the Just Rural Transition initiative, we know that actions like these – as essential as they are – must also incorporate climate, nature, and social equity goals to achieve truly sustainable, resilient, and just food systems. Our latest policy brief, Integrating Climate and Nature Sustainability into Food Crisis Responses, sets out the steps governments and donors must take to ensure triple wins for people, climate, and nature. Our upcoming Community Dialogue will also present a revised set of just rural transition principles for the agrifood sector – see below to find out how you can be involved in this exciting event.


The JRT Secretariat has been working with our Senior Technical Advisor Aaron

New brief finds food crisis responses that support climate and nature



JRT's latest policy brief, <u>Integrating Climate and Nature</u>
<u>Sustainability into Food Crisis Responses</u>, explores how governments and international donors can increase funding to adapt and expand existing programmes to integrate and build on climate and nature objectives while avoiding short-term measures that lock in unsustainable production and consumption patterns.

The brief found that both short- and long-term policy responses to the world's food crisis can maximize opportunities to build long-term resilience, reduce greenhouse gas emissions from agricultural production, and boost ecosystem health. This can deliver sustainable and healthy nutritional outcomes to achieve a triple win for people, climate, and nature.

Meet the women advancing a just rural transition

To celebrate International Women's Day, JRT is championing the women who are working to make a just rural transition a reality. Following recommendations from the JRT community, we're talking to women around the world – from nutrition researchers to renewable energy entrepreneurs to grassroots activists – to find out how their work helps the global agrifood systems become more sustainable, inclusive, and just. Strengthening suppliers to shape equitable food systems

A stable, resilient, and transparent supply chain is essential to a thriving agribusiness sector, and the strengthening of supply chain partners is emerging as a priority for best practice in procurement. JRT and the World Business Council for Sustainable Development have developed **six case studies** highlighting how large agrifood companies can improve market access and strengthen relations with small- and medium-sized suppliers in their value chains. The case studies examine the business case for supplier engagement, explore elements of good procurement practice, and identify lessons learned to promote peer learning.
